Guidelines for participating in the contest

- Contest is open to all the IATLH members of the community from Indian subco and there can be any • number of entries from participants. If you are not member, click the link: 'Ma become a member'.
- Logo should depict the Indian community in the American society in general and Tallahassee in particular, but still distinctly identify the "Indianness".
- Logo can be in full color, but should be conducive to be used in black and white prove in grey shades.
- If colors are being used, then usage of national colors of India (Am) white good and blue), and USA (Red, white and blue) will be given higher scores.

How to participate

- <u>Create Logo</u> Draw / Paint / Print the logo on a lever size while paper with 1" wide clear border on all sides.

Fair contest

- There will be a panel of three judges chosen from all walks of life and communities.
- To keep the contest fair, identity of judges will not be disclosed till judges give their scores.
- Judgment will be based on the criteria given in the guidelines for preparing the logo.
- Copies of the logos will be sent to the judges, who will score the entries on a 100 point scale.
- Entry with maximum score will be declared the winner.
- In case of a tie for the maximum score, IATLH Executive Committee will choose the winner.

Winner of the contest

- Winner will be announced and the prize will be distributed during Azadi Diwas celebrations on August 19, 2007.
- All the participants need to bring/send the safe copy of the drawing with their participant-id. Winning entry will be announced on that day and the winning participants have to identify themselves by showing the safe copy and the participant-id on the safe copy.
- All the entries received and their scores will be announced on that day.
- Winner will be given a trophy, a certificate and "One Year Honorary Membership" of IATLH by waiving off dues for one year of choice of the member.

Closing date: All the entries should be post marked no later than Thursday, August 02, 2007.
